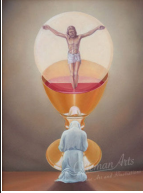

The 4th Annual Hurricane Preparation town hall meeting will be held on **Wednesday, August 4 at 7:30 p.m. in Duffy Center.** As a result of changes in the weather system this year, the number of tropical storms forecast for the Atlantic and Caribbean is the highest in 12 years.

In addition to WPDE-TV broadcasting live prior to the start, presentations will be made by **Ed Piotrowski**, WPDE-TV Chief Meteorologist and **Randy Webster**, Executive Director Horry County Emergency Management. **Russ Dubinsky**, SC Insurance News, will discuss "My house has water in it; is this a flood?" During the question and answer session, **Sam Hodge**, Executive Director Georgetown County Emergency Management, **Nanci Conley**, Red Cross, and **Candace Johnson, RN**, DHEC Special Medical Needs Shelters will also be available.

The *Storm Guide* is being updated for distribution following all Masses on July 31 and August 1, and will be available at the town hall meeting.

RESPECT LIFE STATE DIRECTOR TO SPEAK LOCALLY



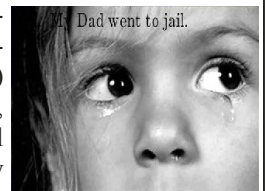
On **Monday, August 9, at 6 pm**, Holly Gatling, Executive Director, South Carolina Citizens for Life, will be at the monthly meeting of the Georgetown Citizens for Life (GCCL) working group. She will provide input for a GCCL reorganization as well as give an overview of Pro-Life activities in South Carolina. A recent success was the passage of a 24-hour waiting period for abortions in South Carolina.

The meeting will be held in the social hall of Georgetown Baptist Church, 600 David W. Ray Road. Take Highway 701 (N. Fraser) out of Georgetown, and go 3.3 miles past Walmart to Pringles Ferry Road. Turn right, and go 0.7 miles to David W. Ray Road. Turn left, and see the church on the right. All interested in Respect Life are invited to attend.

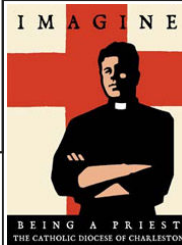

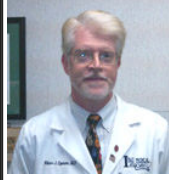

WHAT IS CURSILLO?

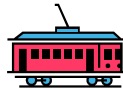
The word Cursillo means "short course". Cursillo is a short course in Christianity. It is a method for personal development of the desire to live an authentic Christian life in response to one's baptism.

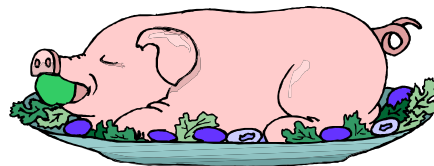

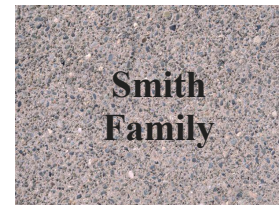
